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Reports

1sts

The 1st XI were coming off a big loss to Knox in Round 5 and looking to claim their first points of the season. It was the second round against Barker and it was time for Cranbrook to level the score at one game apiece.

The team started the game well, dominating possession in the opening 20 minutes and were unlucky not to lead with several close chances. The games remained relatively level for most of the half. Two lapses in concentration allowed Barker to score twice, Cranbrook going into half time trailing.

The second half, again, was very level, and Cranbrook were provided with several opportunities. Unfortunately the final whistle was blown before Cranbrook had the chance to strike. The boys will play St. Aloysius next Wednesday due to the rained out match at the beginning of the term.

1st XI v St Aloysius (CAS R#1 Washed out replay)

4-0

First win of the season!! On Wednesday the 1st XI played a catch up match against St. Aloysius due to the wash out in Round 1. A large crowd got down to Dangar to cheer on the boys and get them over the line.

The Cranbrook boys came out of the blocks fired up and ready to win. Immediately they dominated on the pitch, in what was an extremely muddy and grubby game. It wasn't tough, rough, and didn't reflect the beauty of the game, but was necessary in the wet conditions. A free kick in the 10th minute, finished off by Asha, gave the boys the lead. The score remained the same for most of the half, but the Brook boys were clearly on top. A Jordie Swibel corner then found the head of centre back Matteo who pushed the boys to a 2-0 lead at half time.

The boys were buzzing at half time, they were keen to get back out there and run circles around the Aloys boys. An early red card to the opposition captain because of profanity helped the boys immensely. The boys capitalised, tiring the Aloys boys significantly. A penalty and excellent goal

from Scott Beattie really put the boys in front.

It was an extremely great performance from the boys, who will be hoping to keep the winning feeling alive.

2nds

After a gutsy 1-1 draw against the top of the table Knox, the 2nd XI had plenty to be positive about. Our previous game against Barker was our first of the season, and we knew that we had improved significantly from the opening day. The game kicked off in a tentative fashion, but Cranbrook had an early chance with Theo Burns hitting the woodwork after about 5 minutes. The intensity from the team was very high, as we constantly pinned Barker in their own half, forcing them to play a long ball in the hope their very tall target man would hold the ball up. It wasn't very long until Cranbrook took a deserved lead, with a corner swung in by Alex Conrad finding Tom Callanan who hit a perfectly timed volley into the back of the net. A few minutes later, Oli Adler got his second goal in as many games as he found space outside the box to hit a sweet left foot shot that left the goalkeeper stranded and gave Cranbrook a 2-0 lead. Having never been in such a lead this season, the team sat back and invited constant Barker pressure, which unfortunately resulted in a Barker goal on the stroke of half time, making it Cranbrook 2-1 Barker. Much like the end of the first half, Barker constantly pressured the Cranbrook goal but some terrific goalkeeping from Michael Millington kept Cranbrook ahead. Unfortunately Barker managed to make it 2-2 and force Cranbrook back to square one. However, in true Cranbrook spirit, the team came roaring back with yet another goal from the Alex Conrad corner and a Tom Callanan finish combination, this time with his chest! We had momentum at our back, and we knew we had to push on if we were to take all 3 points. Thankfully, Mike Turner managed to score Cranbrook's fourth and all but seal the game with a clean finish. While Barker attempted to bring the difference to 1 goal, Cranbrook held strong and held on for a memorable 4-2 victory.



The result puts Cranbrook in 3rd place on the ladder and highlights their significant improvement as a team over the course of the term. It was a tremendous team performance and one every player can be proud of.

4th

The 4ths came to the game all positive and ready to face the Barker side for the second time. Barker also brought their A game as they pressed us hard in the first half. The Cranbrook boys struggle to hold possession of the ball during the first half as Barker pressed their attack and scored two goals. Code of conduct

Players

- Play by the rules and in a spirit of good sportsmanship
- Play for the “fun of it” and not just to please parents and coaches.
- Control your temper. Verbal abuse of officials or other players, deliberately fouling or provoking an opponent, and throwing equipment are neither acceptable nor permitted in any sport.
- Work hard both for yourself and your team. Your team’s performance will benefit, so will you.
- Treat all players as you would like to be treated. Do not interfere with, bully or take unfair advantage of another player.
- Co-operate with your coach, team mates and opponents. Without them there would be no game.

In the event of a player, or athlete being sent-off during a CAS fixture, it is the responsibility of that boy’s Headmaster at his discretion to determine the penalty. It is generally understood among Headmasters, however, that the boy will serve at least one week’s suspension from participating in the CAS competition.

Parents

- Focus upon the boy’s efforts and performance rather than the overall outcome of the game. This assists the boy in setting realistic goals related to his ability by reducing emphasis on winning.
- Teach your son that an honest effort is as important as victory, so that the result of the game is accepted without undue disappointment.
- Encourage your always to play according to the rules of the game.
- Never ridicule or yell at your son or another boy for making a mistake or losing a game.
- Remember boys are involved in organised sports for their benefit and enjoyment, not yours.
- Remember that children learn best from example. Applaud good play by both teams.
- If you disagree with an official, raise the issue through the appropriate channels rather than question the official’s judgement and honesty in public. Remember most officials give their time and effort voluntarily for your son’s benefit.

- Support all efforts to remove verbal and physical abuse from sporting activities.
- Recognise the value and importance of coaches. They give of their time and resources to provide recreational activities for your son and other boys and deserve your support.

Spectators

- We encourage boys to support their school teams and to be dressed in the school’s uniform while doing so.
- We expect barracking to be enthusiastic but not to be fanatical or designed to heckle or belittle or disturb the opponents. For example, barracking, for or against, during a kick at goal is always bad sportsmanship. Boys should be encouraged to barrack for their school rather than for an individual team member. Booing, whistling, playing or beating musical instruments are in bad taste and wholly unacceptable.
- Vocal support for any team should never encourage violence or rough or illegal play.
- Encroaching onto the field of play, the shouting out of suggestions for players, referees or umpires to hear are not allowed.
- It is never acceptable to express disapproval of a referee’s or umpire’s decision – no matter whether the referee be adult or schoolboy.
- There is a complete ban on all alcoholic drinks at grounds where games between Associated Schools’ teams are being played.
- We expect our players to be modest in success and generous in defeat, not showing in either case undue emotion. Good play, by our own school and by the opposing school, should be applauded willingly and openly.
- At all times spectators should leave the area tidy and free of rubbish when they leave.
- We look to adults (parents, Old Boys and other spectators) to set an example by their self-control at matches.
